READ USA recruits, trains, and pays local teenagers to deliver one-to-one literacy tutoring to elementary students who are below grade-level reading proficiency. The model, which uses an evidence-based instruction, has proven effective in bringing elementary students up to grade-level reading proficiency.

We provide thousands of Duval County public elementary school students with free books each spring at our annual READ USA Book Fairs, and participate in numerous community events during the year where we provide free books to young children.

## **Proven Literacy Outcomes:**

## Lake Lucina Elementary

Students in READ USA Literacy Tutoring:

- Achieved 79% greater scale score growth than comparison students (23.13 vs. 12.91).
- Showed a 59% higher gain in achievement level from PM1 to PM3 (1.88 vs. 1.18).
- Attended school nearly 5% more than comparison students (10 days more per year).

## **Anchor Academy**

Students in READ USA Literacy Tutoring:

- Demonstrated 54% greater scale score growth than comparison students (19.85 vs. 12.91).
- Achieved an 81% higher gain in achievement level (2.14 vs. 1.18).
- Attended school nearly 3% more than comparison students (6 days more per year).
- 70% were from military families.

"Student confidence levels increased because of their participation, and teachers saw a drastic increase in performance and class participation across the board. Many students are now involved in leadership activities, such as safety patrol—which is a direct result of the increased confidence they built because of READ USA Literacy Tutoring."

#### **READ to Lead Award**

The READ to Lead Award honors an individual who exhibits the bravery and willingness to lead especially when such leadership is difficult.



Peter Racine Retired President, Jacksonville Jaguars Foundation

Peter Racine has dedicated his life to service, guided by his mission to "connect, inspire, and support those creating a better world." Recently retired as Senior Vice President of the Jaguars Foundation, he led more than \$50 million in grants supporting children and families, literacy, education, health, veterans, and animal welfare in Northeast Florida.

Peter began his life of service at Covenant House in New York City, later helping open shelters in Toronto and Houston, and founding Covenant House Honduras, where he served six years as Executive Director. In Jacksonville, he became the first Executive Director of the Northeast Florida Exchange Club Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse, establishing in-home family prevention services in Duval and Clay counties.

He now serves as President of the Center for Central American Empowerment, which he co-founded with his wife, Kelly, to protect and empower women and girls in Central America, and as Minister of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Jacksonville.

Featured in Time Magazine and Dateline NBC for his humanitarian work, Peter has also received two Regional Emmy® Awards and partnered with numerous national and local organizations to advance child and family well-being. He holds degrees from Rutgers University and the Catholic Theological Union.

## Mark Landen Memorial Award for Democracy Through Journalism

For advancing an informed society and strengthening democracy through journalism.



Will Brown Reporter, WJCT News

Will Brown is an award-winning journalist with Jacksonville Today, the digital arm of WJCT Public Media, where he reports on race, poverty, and structural inequality. His parents were avid readers and news consumers; their example spurred Will into serving as a journalist in Texas and Florida for nearly 20 years.

He began at WJCT as a Report for America corps member, covering pivotal stories such as the impact of congressional redistricting on Black voters, the Grand Park mass shooting, and the lasting effects of redlining in Jacksonville. Previously, he reported for the Jacksonville Business Journal, where he chronicled CSX's largest acquisition in decades, and for the St. Augustine Record, where he expanded coverage of women's sports and honored the class of 2020 despite pandemic disruptions.

Earlier in his career, Will worked as a sports reporter for the Victoria Advocate and a business reporter for the Tallahassee Democrat during the Great Recession. A highlight of his career was documenting his 2010 trip to South Africa for the men's World Cup for the Democrat, which was inspired by his reading of Nelson Mandela's Long Walk to Freedom.

A Florida native and proud third-generation Florida A&M Rattler, Will also holds a master's degree from the University of South Florida. He is a devoted husband to Whitney, father to Ben, and dog dad to Finchicus.

By focusing on literacy through high school and beyond, with the support of families, community partners, and The Community Foundation, we are working to ensure every child reads on grade level and is positioned for lifelong success.

# **Our History** How It All Started

READ USA began as a small project between a community volunteer and a teacher at George Washington Carver Elementary School in Duval County. While volunteering as a tutor in Ms. Vanessa Tussey's classroom - where 100% of the students come from a high-poverty neighborhood - Ellen Wiss saw something different and unique occurring in her classroom: struggling students were transforming into engaged, curious learners.

Motivated by what she was seeing, Wiss initiated a dialogue with Ms. Tussey about the increased engagement and outcomes she was witnessing, and asked what was needed most to help more students make the same transformation and replicate this in other classrooms.

Ms. Tussey's response was the spark that ignited READ USA into being: "Books of interest for my students to inspire them to read; books they can choose and own. Reading is key to learning."

Together, Wiss and Tussey raised enough money to hold a free, colorful book fair, providing every student at GWCES with books of their choosing to keep. Demand and support for the Book Choice and Ownership program grew, and READ USA expanded into elementary schools across Duval County.

READ USA incorporated as a 501(c)(3) in 2015 and has since evolved into an established, multi-faceted organization led by literacy experts and support staff all focused on preparing Duval County students for lifelong success through career and literacy excellence.
